
### Rhetoric is...


- ...the art or study of using language effectively





### The Content

- The genre (speech, letter, essay, etc.)
- The purpose
- The message
- The strategies and devices used to accomplish the purpose



# Strategies

- Ethos credibility, experience, authenticity
- Pathos emotional appeal
- Logos facts, research, reason, logic

(Rather than use these actual terms, I would prefer you say something like, "The author plays on the audience's sympathies by recalling vivid, heartbreaking stories of children growing up in poverty-stricken, disease-infested villages.")



### **Devices**

- Anecdotes
- Lit devices (hyperbole, metaphor, simile, repetition, alliteration, cataloging, etc.)
- Diction (word choice)
- Style
- Syntax (word order)
- Parallel structure
- And on and on and on
